ENGLISH

Phonics and Vocabulary

- Collect and classify words with common root (e.g. invent, prevent)
- Check and correct spellings and identify words that need to be learned
- Use more powerful verbs (e.g. rushed instead of went)
- Seek alternatives for overused words and expressions for e.g.
 (nice admirable, delightful, pleasant; good acceptable,
- agreeable, excellent, favourable, valuable)
- Build words from other words with similar meanings, e.g.
 medical, medicine
- Use all the letters in sequence for alphabetical ordering
- Recognise meaning in figurative language
- Match spelling to meaning when words sound the same (homophones), e.g. to/two/too, right/write etc.
- Spell words with common letter strings but different pronunciations e.g. tough, thorough, trough, plough

Grammar and Punctuation

- Identify all the punctuation marks and respond to them when reading
- Practise using commas to mark out meaning within sentences
- Investigate past, present and future tenses of verbs
- Re-read own writing to check punctuation and grammatical sense
- Identify prepositions and practice them while writing sentences

Reading

- Extend the range of reading from a variety of age appropriate books
- Investigate how settings and characters are built up from details
- Explore the impact of imaginary and figurative language in poetry and prose
- Understand the main stages in a story from introduction to resolution
- Understand how paragraphs and chapters are used to organize ideas
- Read further stories or poems by selected authors
- Note key words and phrases to identify the main points in a passage
- Explore narrative order and focus on significant events
- Explore implicit as well as explicit meanings within the text
- Identify different types of non-fiction texts and their known key features
- Understand how points are ordered to make a coherent argument
- Explore the different processes of reading silently and reading aloud

Writing

- Learn the technique of using joined up handwriting in all writing
- Explore different ways of planning stories and write longer stories from plans
- Collect and present information from non-fiction text

- Use paragraphs in writing to organise and sequence ideas
- Explore alternative openings and ends for stories
- Explore the layout and presentation of writing to fit its purpose
- Make short notes from a text and use these to aid writing
- Summarise a sentence or a paragraph in a limited number of words.

- Reduce a fraction to its 'lowest terms' or simplest form
- Compare and order two or more proper fractions with like or unlike denominators and numerators
- Use strategies to add and subtract two or more fractions and / or mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators

Measurement

- Use tiling patterns to find area
- Measure area using squared paper

Geometry

- Identify the different types of angles and their properties (right, acute, obtuse, straight)
- Measure and construct angles using protractor
- Measure and construct circle of a given measurement
- Calculate the radius from the given diameter and vice versa
- Measure and construct squares and rectangles using geometric tools

Data Handling

- Read, create and use tally chart and bar graph
- Arrange data in columns and rows
