Week 1 and 2 | December 9 to December 20 2019

Theme: Vegetable

Key topics covered

- Exploring different ways of cooking vegetables (solar, frying, boiling and blanching)
- Raw and cooked vegetables
- Discussion on importance of vegetables
- Importance of storage and care of vegetables
- Where vegetables are grown?
- How vegetables can be preserved for future use?
- · Vegetables with skin, without skin

- First hand experience of cooking using different techniques in class
- Hands on experience of buying vegetables from vegetable vendor
- Watching a video for storage and care of vegetables
- Exploring different places where vegetables are grown through video
- Exploring encyclopedia in classroom


Math and Language learning

- Introduction of number 19 and writing numbers
- Dictation of numbers and writing before and after numbers
- Introduction of shape Pyramid
- Introduction of concept Ascending order
- Enhancing recalling skill by playing memory game
- Introduction of estimation through real objects (pebbles, counters, sketch pens, erasers etc.)
- Recalling and quantifying the number through a game
- Creating different pattern by using beads, ice-cream sticks, crayons, pencils, pencil colours, marbles, counter etc.
- Segregating pictures and creating a pictograph
- Introduction of "ub" rhyming words- tub, cub,rub,hub
- Introduction of sight words-how, we, our , what, why etc.
- Framing sentences and writing them in notebook
- Reading and writing simple sentences and drawing of the same
- Identifying sight words through hopscotch game
- Reading and framing sentences from thematic words and doing activities from reading material

January 2 to January 8 2020 Week 3

Theme: Animal Kingdom Phase 1

Key topics covered

- Exploring children basic knowledge about animal kingdom
- Places where animals live
- Children's knowledge about animal food habits
- Uses and care of animals

Some activities conducted

- Passing the parcel game and sharing name of an animal
- Listening to different sounds of animals and identifying the same



Math and Language learning

- Introduction of number 20
- Identifying number from 1-19 on number line and understanding of related operations.
