ENGLISH

Listening and Speaking

- Answer questions and explain further when asked
- Listen to others and respond appropriately
- Listen carefully to questions and instructions
- Read aloud and tell stories; recite rhymes, poems and songs
- Converse with friends, teachers and other adults and ask simple questions
- Contribute to discussions within a group
- Take turns in speaking
- Speak confidently to a group to share experiences
- Retell stories with appropriate use of story language

Phonics and Vocabulary

- Begin to use the terms 'consonant' and 'vowel' in talking about letter sounds
- Recognize and use the digraphs 'ch', 'sh', 'th'
- Extend vocabulary from reading
- Practice blending phonemes for reading, and segmenting phonemes for spelling
- Identify the initial and final consonant clusters (bl, cl, fl)
- Recognize common word endings such as 's', 'ed', 'ing'
- Identify separate sounds (phonemes) within words, which may be represented by more than one letter

Grammar and Punctuation

- Identify sentences in a text
- Notice how punctuation (eg: full stop, question mark, capital letter)

helps to mark out meaning

- Know that the end of a sentence is marked with a full stop
- Know that a capital letter is used for 'I', for names and for the start of a sentence
- Use pronouns (he, she, I, they) in a sentence appropriately
- Use prepositions (time and place - in, on, at, in front of, behind, above, under, before, after, near, far, in-between) in a sentence appropriately
- Use joining words such as 'and', 'but' in sentences
- Know the use of articles 'a', 'an' and 'the' in a sentence

Reading

- Read a range of common words on sight
- Use alphabetic order of initial letters (eg: to locate names and words for spellings)
- Use knowledge of letter sounds to read simple consonant-vowel-consonant words and to attempt decoding other words
- Use all information available (e.g.: pictures, punctuation, words) to make sense of what is read
- Read a range of books (fiction and nonfiction), discussing preferences
- Anticipate what happens next in the story
- Read familiar and simple stories and poems, and relate words said and read
- Identify and discuss characters and dialogue
- Recognize story elements (eg: beginning, middle and end)
- Read and talk about own writing
- Read and comprehend short passages

Writing

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Develop a comfortable and an efficient pencil grip ● Form letters correctly ● Spell familiar common words accurately, drawing on sight vocabulary ● Use knowledge of sounds to write simple regular words, and to attempt other words ● Compose and write a simple sentence with a capital letter and a full stop ● Write a sequence of sentences (5-7) retelling a familiar story or recounting an experience ● Locate information (e.g.: in lists, charts, stories) and record answers to questions
<p>MATHS</p>	<p>Number system</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Count using concrete objects and with one to one correspondence (0-100) ● Identify the numbers before, after or between (1 to 100) ● Arrange the numerals 80-89 in ascending and descending order ● Demonstrate the place value of a digit in a 2 digit number (from 80-89) by expanding and/ or converting expanded form to a 2 digit numeral ● Represent problems involving addition and subtraction as mathematical statement ● Add 2 or 3 2-digit numbers with and without regrouping (vertically or horizontally) <p>Algebra</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify and repeat a pattern using shapes, size, color and numbers ● Interpret and solve for missing numbers OR write signs +, - and = appropriately and in context while working with addition and subtraction

equations

- Create and describe your own repeating pattern.

Measurement

- Understand and use the terms taller-shorter, longer-shorter
- Use the centimeter ruler to measure small lengths and small distances
- Compare and estimate the length between two objects
- Recognize and work with mass units like 1kg and 500g and work with these units practically
- Use non standard measuring equipment like cups, glasses, buckets to measure capacity
- Solve word problems related to weight using addition or subtraction skills learnt (using only kg as unit).

Geometry

- Recognize 3d shapes (cube, cuboid, cylinder, cone, sphere) from the environment and speak about its properties using terms like sides/edge, corners, faces etc.

Time and calendar

- Know the total number of days in a month
- Can tell time to the hour and use the term O'clock
- Know names of the days of the week and months in sequence
- Know the relationship of days to week, weeks to month, months to year.
- Know the number of days in a month (30,31,28,29).

Data handling

- Get basic understanding of how to represent data using a Venn diagram
