## 1. INTRODUCTION TO ICSE:

**I.C.S.E.** stands for **Indian Certificate of Secondary Education.** It is an examination that is conducted by the CISCE (Council for Indian School Certificate Examinations) for **Class 10**. (For more information, visit <a href="https://www.cisce.org">www.cisce.org</a>)

Note: The above schedule is tentative and subject to change based on further requirements. Summer holidays will be from 28th April 2018 to 10th June 2018.

### 4. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

- a. The syllabus of Class 9 in **English and Hindi (Compulsory)** will continue in Class 10. Questions will be set from the entire syllabus for Class 10 examination (Class 9 and 10).
- b. The syllabus in other **subjects** are prescribed separately for Class 9 and Class 10. The syllabus prescribed for Class 9 will be examined internally by the school and the syllabus for Class 10 will be examined externally by the Council.
- c. The examination at the end of Class 9 will be conducted by the schools and the promotion of candidates from Class 9 to Class 10 will be the responsibility of the Heads of the Schools in accordance with the attendance and pass criteria as laid down by the Council.

d. The result of the **Indian Certificate of Secondary Education** (Year- 10) Examination will be based on the external examination at the end of Class 10 and on Socially Useful Productive Work and Community Service, evaluated internally by the School.

### 5. CO- CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR AREAS

High school students will be offered the following co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in addition to the above subjects-

- 1. Socially Useful and Productive work (SUPW) and IAYP projects
- 2. Sports and Physical Education
- 3. Performing Arts
- 4. Self-Enrichment A life skills development Program
- 5. House Activity and Intra-school activities

Apart from this, students will be exposed to various activities in the following ways-

- 1. Field trips and industry visits
- 2. Apprenticeships and interactions with experts from various fields
- 3. Film screenings and discussions
- 4. Seminars on books and various topics
- 5. Celebration of various festivals, national and international days
- 6. Exchange with students of other schools/institutes
- 7. Participation in external competitive and non-competitive platforms
- 8. Independent research projects

# About Socially Useful Productive Work (SUPW) and Community Service and IAYP Projects:

It is a compulsory subject. This covers SUPW and Community Service prescribed by the Council. The assessment in "Socially Useful Productive Work and Community Service" will be done internally and the result will count towards the award of the Certificate. Students at Redbricks (Class 9 to Class 12) are required to enroll themselves for the IAYP programme and complete it as a part of their SUPW requirements.

**About IAYP:** IAYP is a certification programme for International Award for Young People. The motive of the Award Programme is the self-development of young people

of age group between 14-25 years old and to help them to equip with life skills and to empower young people with different activities. Award offers three levels and child can enroll in any one of the three levels of the Award after meeting the age criteria. Three different levels of Awards are:

- **Bronze:** Minimum age 14 years (Minimum time commitment: 6 months)
- **Silver:** Minimum age 15 years (Minimum time commitment: 12 months and for Bronze award holders: 6 months)
- Gold: Minimum age 16 years (Minimum time commitment: 18 months and for Bronze award holders: 12 months)

Participants need to show regular activity and commitment during their award programme. They should spend at least one hour per week for each activity. Students are involved in the following activities:

- 1. Service Section: It includes community service related projects.
- 2. **Skills:** It involves one skill-based project under the guidance of an expert mentor.
- 3. Physical Recreation: It involves some form of regular physical activity.
- 4. Adventurous Journey: It includes outbound explorations and expeditions.

### 6. CAREER GUIDANCE

As students enter high school, it is important for them start planning their future career goals. The school will provide support of a career counselor who would orient students to various aspects of planning their careers. The counselor would also guide students to identify their aptitude and plan their further career steps.

The school will organize for some basic services from the career counselor, such as information sessions with students, etc. In addition, students may be required to contribute fees towards availing of specialized services from the career counseloraptitude testing, individual career guidance, etc.

Apart from the career counselor, the school's teachers will be guides and mentors for high school students in making the career choices as per their interests and skills.

The assessment in "Socially Useful Productive Work and Community Service" will be made by the school, and the result will count towards the award of the ICSE Certificate.

### Assessment in Class 9

- Class 9 Students will have two semester-end examinations conducted internally by the school.
- Promotion from Class 9 to Class 10 requires the students to have obtained at least 33% marks in five subjects including English on the cumulative average and a minimum attendance of 75% of the working days.
- Apart from the semester-end examinations, students will be assessed internally and continuously through graded assignments, practical work, cycle tests, classwork and homework performance. A tentative break-up of assessment semester-wise for Class 9 is given as below-
