Theme 1- Water, Air and Materials

Central Idea: Water, air and materials are resources that sustain life on earth.

Lines of Inquiry:

Understanding sources, characteristics of air and water
Uses and significance of clean water and air
Natural and man-made materials around us
Our responsibility to keep water and air clean

Theme 2- Celebrations and Traditions

Central Idea: Celebrations and traditions are expressions of shared beliefs and values.

Lines of Inquiry:

Why people celebrate
How people relate and build connections with celebrations
Beliefs and values related to celebrations

Project 1- My body and its needs

Central Idea: Our body is made up of different external and internal parts that are interconnected to make it functional.

Lines of Inquiry:

Various external and internal parts of our body and their functions
Actions performed by some body parts
All parts of the body are interdependent
Growth cycle of the body depends on healthy habits

Theme 3- Living Things – Plants and Animals

Central Idea: Characteristics and uses of plants and animals help us to categorize them in various ways.

Lines of Inquiry:

Identifying features of plants and animals that help sort them under different categories
Plants produce and store food
Plants and animals are useful to us
Our responsibility towards other living beings

Central Idea: Transportation systems have developed through time to enhance connectivity

Lines of Inquiry:

Similarities and differences in means of transport
Importance of various means of transport
Evolution of transportation systems from past to present
Significance of Road safety

Theme 4- Seasons and their Impact

Central Idea: Seasons caused by Earth's movement have an impact on the living world.

Lines of Inquiry:

Why there are different seasons
Crops and fruits grow according to the seasons
Effect of seasons on life on earth and changes observed in the environment

Theme 5- History of mankind

Central Idea: How we live today is influenced by the way people lived in the past.

Lines of Inquiry:

Changes and connections in human lifestyles from past to present
Reasons for changes in human lifestyles
How inventions and discoveries are connected with human needs
