By the end of the year, students should be able to:

E1 LISTENING AND SPEAKING

- E 1.1 Attempt to express ideas precisely using a growing vocabulary
- E 1.2 Show awareness of the listener by including relevant details
- E 1.3 Listen carefully and respond appropriately asking questions of others
- E 1.4 Explain plans and ideas, extending them in the light of discussion
- E 1.5 Show confidence in speaking to a group
- E 1.6 Articulate clearly so that others can hear
- E 1.7 Begin to be aware of the use of more formal vocabulary and tone of voice
